

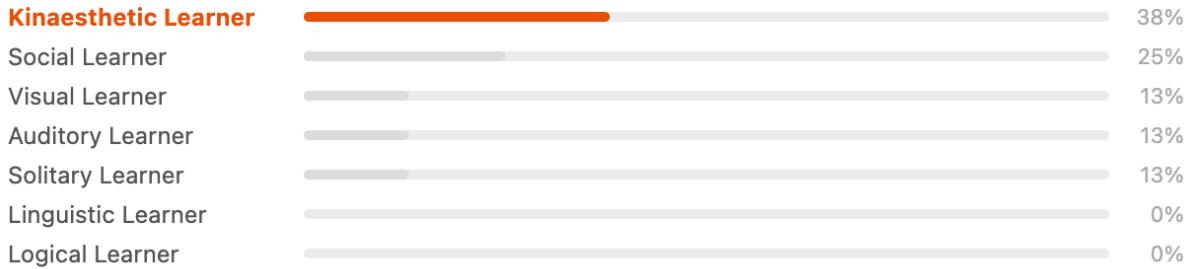

- Use past exam papers regularly throughout your revision, not just at the end
- Try interactive tools like Desmos or GeoGebra to explore functions hands-on
- Break revision into short focused bursts with practice tasks in between
- Look for real-world contexts for maths topics, it makes abstract ideas feel concrete
